### 4.0 TREASURERS REPORT.

- 1) The current bank balance is £7,921.91. £4,600 is already earmarked for projects such as the Playground.
- 2) Andrew Drysdale advised that the cost for the App will be slightly less now around £49.
- 3) Pauline Pender to apply for the Lottery Licence at a cost of £20.
- 4) Pauline Pender asked whether the Accounts need to be audited. Jenny Sprott advised that Midlothian Council suggest getting it done and it is in the Constitution. Lynne Smiths husband has previously agreed to provide this service. Pauline Pender to follow up.

**FUNDING REQUESTS.** 

- 1) Lynsey Stevenson requested funding to supply class t-shirts for Sporting Events. It was agreed to fund at a cost of £5 per t-shirt. Lynsey Stevenson to action order. Trish Watt to action cheque.
- 2) Lynsey Stevenson requested funding for the Generation Science event to take part early next year which will involve every pupil. After discussion it was agreed to fund £1,000 and discuss further possible assistance with funding at the next Partnership meeting. Trish Watt to action cheque.
- 3) Lynsey Stevenson requested funding for the Rookie Rock Stars concert to take part in December. It was agreed to fund £250. Trish Watt to action cheque.
- 4) Claire McEwan-Muir requested funding for the Nursery to provide a Play Dough station, sand and soil at a cost of approximately £120. Discussion took place over recent funding to the Nursery. It was agreed to fund £60 in the first instance and for Lynsey Stevenson to discuss the outstanding with Nursery Staff and then report back at the next meeting.

10.0 PLAYGROUND UPDATE.

- 2) Construction of the outdoor classroom is likely to take place in November as the team who construct it have been working on other projects.
- 3) We did not achieve funding from either the Tesco Grant nor the Army Covenant Grant but have assurance from Gary that the MUGA we have secured is going to still be available while we find alternative sources of funding.
- 4) The Awards for All end of Grant Report has been submitted, it was reported that the project received addition funding which allowed the project to be expanded and the Funding Manager reported back that there is no issue with this. We do need to keep accounts and records of the project for the next 7 years, this is standard accounting conditions so presumably the council and school work to these rules?
- 5) Catherine and Pauline have been looking for suitable grant funding to explore, in order to facilitate the installation of the

- 6) Lynsey and Pauline did a walk round of the school grounds to identify areas which need work:
  - More logs and tyres for the children to play on would be useful.
  - The friendship benches have been installed, we wonder if a date has been agreed for Sandra to do Mural behind the P1 bench?
  - The maze has caused concern for some parents and the progress to fill it has become very laborious so we are looking for ideas on alternative materials to fill it.
  - The large planters need work, they are looking very tired and although the school has obtained spring bulbs to plant the planters need work before these can be planted.
  - It was thought a gardening morning where children, parents and grandparents or other relatives are invited into school to help with weeding and pruning now that the growing season has finished. Possibly a regular parent gardening group could be set up to try keep on top of the general garden maintenance.
    - Games and blackboards for the younger year's walls would brighten the walls up and possibly art work for the walls around the upper school.
  - Outdoor picnic tables for the children to either work at or have lunch in good weather.
  - We would like to explore possible sources of funding to get the playground and garden areas looking good.
  - Lynsey is going to contact volunteer Midlothian to enquire about help to get with garden weeding and maintenance.
