Literacy

We are continuing to look at initial and final blends, diagraphs and alternative spelling patterns during phonics activities.

Primary 1 will continue with our reading books, but we will also be looking at finding information in non-fiction texts.

For writing we are looking at creating personal and imaginative stories as well as creating posters and trying out some poetry.

Numeracy and Maths

We will continue to deepen our understanding of numbers to 20 or 30 as well as addition and subtraction. We will also be working on grouping and sharing quantities within 20. A new Numeracy homework task will follow shortly.

For Maths we will be looking at money by identifying different coins and adding different amounts together before covering work on Time. We will look at analogue and digital times.

Interdisciplinary Learning

At the start of term we are going to be looking at Living Things and thinking about what plants need to grow. We will be planting lots of seeds and look after them over the term. We are looking forward to our trip to the Royal Botanics.

We will then move onto our Fairyland topic, which will include work on castles. Children will be reading lots of different stories in school.

Health & Wellbeing

Our PE days for this term continue to be Monday and Tuesday. Please ensure that children have their gym kit on these days. We have been enjoying lots of exciting activities during Health Week.

We will be completing the 'Keeping Ourselves Safe' programme, which helps us consider our personal safety in different scenarios.
