Literacy

In Writing we are currently working on creating lots of descriptive poetry using our knowledge of grammar; including adjectives, verbs and onomatopoeia.

In Reading, we will look at different comprehension strategies to help us understand texts. We will be researching books and the Internet for information on our topic.

We continue to work hard on our grammar, handwriting and spelling.

Numeracy/Maths

In Maths this term we will continue to develop our understanding of money as well as exploring maps, compass directions and coordinates to help us with our Climate topic. In Numeracy, we will be working on strategies for addition and subtraction and continuing to work on our 2,3,4,5 and 10 times tables. Lots of practise at home will help!
