I would also like to extend a very warm welcome to all new pupils and their families who have just joined our school community. We all hope that you have settled well and are very happy at Cornbank. A huge welcome also to our new members of staff: Mrs Stacey Murray - Learning Assistant, Mrs Michelle Kelly, Mrs Anna Leask and Mrs Carol Tweedie who are our new Child Care and Development Workers working in our nursery this session. We are also delighted to welcome two Newly Qualified Teachers (NQTs) this session - Miss Emma Hopkirk in P2b and Miss Megan Pearston P7. For me, this is always an exciting time of the year as we look at our plans and ideas for this new school session.

We have had a very busy month of September with lots of learning happening at Cornbank Primary School. During our Establishment Phase there has been a focus in every class about creating a class charter as we work towards being a Rights Respecting School. At our Update Monday gatherings we have been launching our focus for the week, this has included:

Rights Respecting Schools, Cornbank Toolkit Revision, What is a Midlothian Learner, Roald Dahl's 100th Birthday and the First Minister's Reading Challenge.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Over the summer we had our lighting replaced, so hopefully children and staff have noticed a difference! Some painting work will be undertaken during the October school break where the new lighting has been installed. We are absolutely delighted to see that our new trim track has been installed in our infant playground as is accessible to our nursery pupils too. A huge thank you to the Cornbank School Partnership for working so hard to help improve our outdoor area. We are looking to complete our outdoor maze using natural materials. P2 classes have been busy collecting branches with parental support but it has been more challenging than we first thought! This is a work in progress and will be working hard to ensure that the fully completed maze is created with as many natural materials as we can gather! MEET THE TEACHER



Many thanks to everyone who attended this very successful event. The feedback from the many parents and children that I have spoken to about the evening has been very positive. Parents appreciated sharing the meet the teacher with their child(ren) and learning about their class and the learning which is taking place. We hope you all managed to notice our Rights Respecting Charters in each class. This show cases all the fantastic learning which has been taking place and our real awareness of our rights and the global community.

Our teachers also enjoyed welcoming families into their classes too, and having the opportunity to talk with you. There will be an opportunity for one to one consultations at our Parent Consultation Meetings on 1st and 3rd November. Letters about our appointment system will be issued shortly.

SICKNESS



At this time of year, children are off with sickness bugs which can spread easily if we do not take a proactive approach to containing the germs. We do what we can in school by encouraging children to wash their hands at appropriate times, and by sending sick children home as soon as they are unwell.

I would urge you not to send your child to school if they have sickness or diarrhoea or if they are showing symptoms of these. They should not come to school for 48 hours afterwards so it is completely out of their system. This way we can avoid it spreading. We appreciate your continuing support with this issue.

ASSEMBLIES

This year again, every class or year group will hold their own class assembly, during which they will share with you their learning. We would like to invite parents and carers of the children performing to attend these assemblies on Friday mornings at 9:15 am. The Cornbank School Partnership offer tea and coffee for parents in the dining hall before each class assembly. Further information has been issued in our annual calendar and is also available on our school website.

Well done to our P5/6 pupils who delivered the first class assembly on Friday 30th with a Rights Respecting focus. Our nursery pm class will be invited along to the dress rehearsals on a Thursday afternoon for a sneak preview.

Our next school assembly is our first House Assembly where children are invited to wear their house colours and the winning house for this term will be announced and the house treat will be shared. Mrs Stevenson will lead our final assembly this session where the children will be learning all about Harvest. All children are invited to bring in a donation which will now go to the local Food Bank. A letter with more information will be issued regarding this.

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COATS AND LABELLING OF CLOTHES

ROLE OF THE HOUSE AND VICE CAPTAINS



Our House and Vice Captains play an integral role throughout the school session. Every Thursday morning they have the very important job of collecting, counting and recording all of the house points gained by our children throughout the week. They then announce the points collected at an assembly every Friday.

As a school we have recently purchased and are awaiting the arrival of our new house points tokens and also storage for the points. This will be located in the foyer of our school so children can visually see the house points being collected across the whole school. We think this will help to encourage children to earn more points for their houses. We hope this will be in place for our parental consultations in November so you can see how each house is doing.

JRSOs

This stands for Junior Road Safety Officers and we have a pupil voice group who are working on keeping our children safe. We were happy to be involved in the JRSO launch at Woodburn Primary School in August. Two of our JRSO's accompanied Mrs Turnbull to the launch and they returned to school with lots of great ideas and very excited about how they can implement these ideas at Cornbank.

As part of their work, they will help us to make sure everyone takes a safe route to school, cycles safely and support us with our future Parksmart Campaigns, ensuring that our parents and carers use all of the correct designated places for picking up and dropping off.

They are busy promoting our Walk to School Week which begins on Monday 3rd October.



RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOLS - KNIGHTS FOR RIGHTS

We are busy working towards our First Level Award so we will keep you up dated when we have further information. A few of our 'Knights for Rights' pupils visited George Watsons College on Friday, with Miss Gordon, to share their learning with other schools working towards Rights Respecting Schools accreditation.

This was a fantastic opportunity for our children to hear about the journey other schools have taken. Our Knights for Rights Pupil Voice Group has a very important role to play every session, but especially this session as this group of children will be leading our school towards gaining our Level 1 award. They will be working closely with Miss Gordon and Mrs Stevenson to ensure everyone knows about their rights.

We hope that children are sharing their learning at home and can explain why they have created their own class charter.

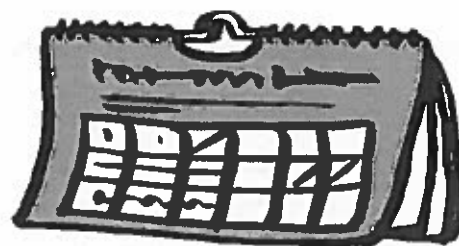
