This week our activities are based around the fairy tale 'The 3 Little Pigs'.


Monday

Literacy Activity

Story Sequencing

Once you think you've got it, read or listen to the story of the 3 Little Pigs to check. Did you manage to get them all in order? If not, give it another go!




Wednesday

With an adult, have a chat about the pictures on the sheet in your pack and what the words on the page say. Colour in the faces to show how you think the pigs and wolf were feeling in each picture. Are they happy, sad, angry or scared? Think about which colour you would use for each feeling and use that to colour in the faces.



Thursday

Themed Recipe

Little Pig Cupcakes

Can you turn an ordinary cupcake into a lovely little pig? You can either bake your own cakes or buy some plain cakes from the shop!

For decorating, you will need:

- Icing sugar
- Pink food colouring
- Pink marshmallows
- Chocolate chips



Method

If you've made your own cupcakes, give them the chance to cool down first (you can also use a digestive biscuit instead of a cake!) Then, mix the icing sugar with some water until it is thick enough and add a tiny amount of pink food colouring, mixing it together. Spread the icing over the cupcakes until they are smooth. Use the chocolate chips as the pig's eyes and a marshmallow for the nose. Add two drops of food colouring to the marshmallow to create nostrils. Cut one marshmallow in half and pinch the edge so that you can stick them on as pointy ears. Enjoy!

Little Pig Mask

Using the paper plate attached, can you create your own pig mask? There are also templates for a tail, nose and ears in your pack, but you can try and make your own if you want. Ask an adult to cut out the eye shapes for you. Attach the lolly stick and have fun pretending to be one of the 3 Little Pigs! Maybe you could act out the story as one of the pigs using your mask!
