At Cornbank Primary, home learning is underpinned by our shared vision 'everyone works together to inspire learners to be their best now and in the future'.

Home Learning has been reviewed with families in 2016, 2017 and 2019.

Planning

Home Learning should follow up learning that has already taken place in class and should be linked to termly plans.

Activities

Within P2-7, home learning is issued as below:

- Home learning is issued on a three week basis, with one week then allowing for feedback from teachers/peers in school.
- Tasks should be set over Google Classroom, with jotters provided for children to complete tasks. We aim for all children to be able to complete the tasks, and so paper copies of some activities may be provided from time to time (e.g. cut and stick activities).
- There should be 3 sets of Spelling words and different activities to complete
- There will be 3 Numeracy/Maths activities with a mix of tasks (e.g. online games to play, written worksheets or practical activities). These will be appropriate to the age and stage of the child.
- Children will complete a 'Class Choice' activity
- Reading continues to be issued either with separate tasks set through Google Classroom or through independently completed reading diaries.
- When classes are completing novel studies, children should have the opportunity to read for enjoyment, and there will be no set reading homework.
- While home learning is encouraged, we do not issue consequences for children who do not complete tasks, recognising that home routines are different for everyone.

Within P1, home learning follows a different routine, with opportunities provided to practise new phonics sounds/blends and practical Numeracy tasks. Reading is issued weekly.

Assessment

Class teachers aim to provide feedback to acknowledge work completed. This is normally through Google Classroom.

Moderation

- Copies of Linking our Learning activities are proof read by DHT or PT before being issued, to ensure consistency across stages.
