Literacy

This term, as part of our work on RSHP, we will be looking at Social Media and keeping ourselves safe online. Numeracy and Maths

In Maths this term, P5 will be working on Money. This will involve counting coins, giving change, calculating amounts and working within a budget. 2d, 3d shape and probability will also be worked on.

In Numeracy, we will continue to learn our tables and to get faster at mentally calculating Maths Basic Facts. Division, decimals and percentages are the main Numeracy topics for this term.

Topic/IDL

This term our topic is Seas and Oceans. We will be learning about the oceans of the world, where they are (involving mapping skills), investigating different levels of the ocean, researching different animals and plants of the oceans and giving a talk about a sea creature. We will also be looking at the problems facing our oceans today and thinking of ways in which we can help. The children will be creating fact files about an ocean and will be taking part in World Ocean Day on June 8th.
