


Class Organisation


Transition



School Day

What if my child is unwell?

- Please do not send your child to school if they are unwell
- Telephone the school by 8.50am
- If you don't phone, we must text and/or phone to establish the reason for absence
- If your child becomes unwell at school, a member of staff will contact you to discuss





What if my child has medication?

- All staff are trained in Emergency First Aid
- Consent form
 - Regular medication e.g. inhaler
 - Self-administered medication see the office staff






Payments
