The process of transition occurs over time beginning well before children start school and extending to the point where learners and families feel a sense of belonging to the school and when educators recognise this sense of learning

Transition



- There are currently 34 children registered to start in August 2024 from both Cornbank ELC and other early years settings (this is subject to change)
- You must register your child at your catchment school – placement requests follow later (April/May)
- Transition will start after the Easter break
- Early Years staff and P1 teachers will liaise to share information during this time

Transition



- All children will take part in the Midlothian wide 'Midmouse' project
- ELC/Partnership Nurseries and P1 teachers will liaise to share information and arrange visits to ensure a smooth transition
